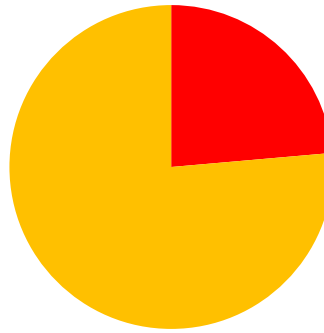

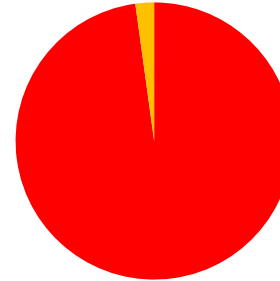

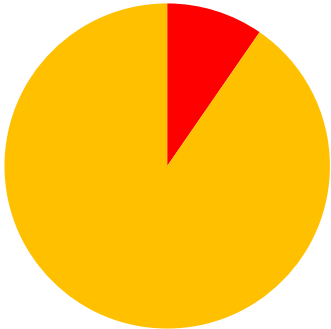

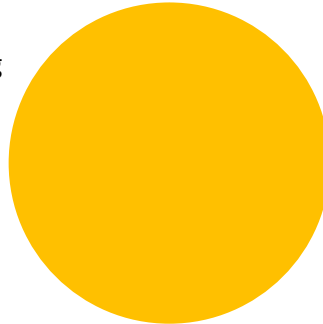

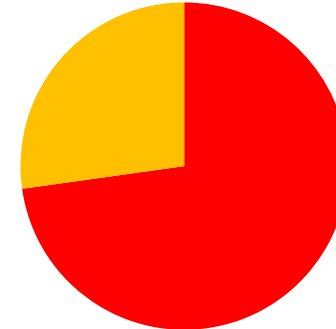

STRUGGLING

The households who are unsheltered or in emergency shelter or transitional housing programs face struggles beyond their housing crisis. These struggles are often in an acute phase because of the housing crisis.

21% are chronically homeless

7% are veterans

16% manage serious mental illness

32% are challenged by substance addiction

31% are survivors of domestic violence

7% have an experience with foster care

What About the Children?



11	kids in emergency shelter
28	kids in transitional housing
5	kids in permanent housing programs
74	kids doubled up and at-risk
33	kids living in unsafe conditions
<u>192</u>	<u>kids doubled up & OK for now</u>
343	kids we ought to be worried about
